**County Matters:**

Broadband – LN Communications have been approved as the Contractor, approx £15 per month and a connection charge of £50.00 giving a 5 Meg speed. This is now available.

Incinerator – JW stated there was not much change to the situation at the moment. The expectation is that a decision will be taken in April. There will be a site visit and the date will be made public. JW fears the application will go through at that stage. JW intends to develop an alternative plan for the management of waste on the Allerton Quarry site that does not include incineration. The PC confirmed that it would be returning its comments on the application to NYCC by the end of the month and offered its support to JW as he considers alternatives.

**District Matters:**

AA stated HBC Cabinet approved council budget and there will be no increase on council tax.

AA stated that Harrogate Theatre and the Royal Hall will be working together on projects in the future and HBC were viewing this as a cost cutting initiative.

AL thanked Roger Naish for the wine and pizza evening to raise funds which had been a great success. Thanks were also expressed to Simon Robinson who supported the evening.

AL updated recent activity, including reports on meetings held in December with NYCC and HBC Planning Officers. The PC will submit comments to both by the end of

January. The PC agreed to support a proposal from NYWAG to instruct and fund further work on landscape impact.

## 2. Playing Fields

- RN mentioned the tennis court committee were unsuccessful in their application for a grant. Other options were being explored.

## 3. Village Shop/Village Hall

- The new lighting was recognised as a resounding success. The invoice for the lighting invoice will be passed to PC a.s.a.p. The Village Hall Committee are considering buying a data projector for the hall. The PC welcomed this initiative which will be of use to a number of groups.

## 4. Planning

AA confirmed that there is to be no council tax increase.

**Matters Arising:**

1. Incinerator

AL reported that the full response to the Allerton Waste Recovery Park application had been made to NYCC and was now posted on the application web site. The submission was made on behalf of Marton-cum-Grafton Parish Council and nine other parish councils. AL formally thanked PC members, Brian Cooper and members of the Parish Council's group for their support.

AL noted that NYCC had informed AmeyCespa that because of outstanding questions regarding their application they did not expect to determine the application until July or August 2012. AmeyCespa have indicated that they are happy to work to this schedule but that they still wish to process the application sooner than this if possible.

HBC Planning Committee is a statutory consult tee on the application. Their Planning Committee will meet to discuss the proposal on February 14<sup>th</sup> in the main Council debating chamber at 2.15 pm. Members of the public are encouraged to attend the meeting and to make their objections known, including via a small protest both outside the HBC main building (12.30pm-2.15pm) and also beforehand if a site visit is proposed. The PC agreed to circulate a note to residents to confirm the above.

**Matters Arising:**

1. Incinerator

AL thanked Cllr John Watson, Cllr Anthony Alton and members of the Parish for their support at the recent Harrogate Borough Council Planning Committee meeting that considered the AmeyCespa application for a waste disposal facility at Allerton Park. The committee concluded a "strong objection" on grounds of: contrary to the HBC core strategies and local plan; adverse impacts on Allerton Park (buildings and grounds); mass and scale of the proposals; concerns over highway issues; adverse impact on the countryside; need for an incinerator not been proven both now and into the future; concern over toxic fumes; information in the planning application is inadequate particularly in relation to the impacts on the landscape and adjacent heritage asset; the siting of the incinerator may not be the most appropriate to make best use of the heat and/or power generated; concern as to whether the private finance initiative was the most appropriate mechanism to deliver this project or a reduced scheme (although it was recognised this was not strictly a planning consideration).

Harrogate Borough Council is a statutory consultee on this application and therefore their views will be considered later in the year when NYCC determines the application. The date of that determination is uncertain because of additional information that NYCC has required the applicant to supply – it is likely to be during the summer.

signage, however, they did suggest that the village could provide their own signs and put them on private land subject to planning consent. The Clerk discussed the possibility of lowering the speed limit in the village but NYCC Highways said that they would only consider certain areas in the village such as by the school. PC decided that this was not a problem area and it should not be considered further.

The Clerk had contacted North Yorkshire Police who said that they do not run any Community speed groups but suggested that they could send a police car and speed gun to check speeding at certain times. PC discussed this and agreed that the Clerk should contact the Police to arrange for police speeding checks in the next 12 months.

**Chair's Report (AL)**

I am delighted to provide the Chair's report of Parish Council business to this year's Annual General Meeting. The Parish Council met formally on 12 occasions, and informally on countless other times as we sought to oppose the Allerton Park incinerator - more of which to come.

But first, I want to start by paying thanks to two members of the Parish Council and welcome a third. We were delighted to welcome Zoe Hartley-Metcalf as our new Parish Council Clerk in July 2011. Zoe has rapidly got up to speed with the workings of the Parish Council, which is no mean feat given the range of issues that we have been dealing with. Secondly, I want to thank Councillor Nicholas Wilson for his longstanding service on the Parish Council during the last 17 years, ten of which he served as Council Chair. By any measure that is a very considerable contribution and few members of the Parish have given so much to our community over such a sustained period of time. We will miss Nick's considerable knowledge of the District and County, his intimate knowledge and regard for the Parish, and his willingness to roll up his sleeves and get things done. Finally, a warm welcome to Councillor Nicholas Duxbury as our newly elected member of the Parish Council - we look forward very much to working with you in the coming months and years.

Many of the issues that have taken up the deliberations of the Parish Council are common to previous years. This is not to say we have not made progress in these areas, but rather to highlight the reassuringly predictable nature of how a community moves with the times. The financial cuts that are affecting the economy are having a direct impact in our Parish, indeed the state of our roads is now the worst in living memory. Even when the pot-holes on Braimber Lane and Limebar Lane are marked up in yellow paint, they lie unrepaired for months, getting progressively deeper and wider. The bus service that connects the village to Ripon, Boroughbridge and York runs at ever less

frequent times, and the chance of us ever being connected to Harrogate remains a distant dream. Speeding in the village remains a persistent problem and at times we have had to remind ourselves and our community that PC stands for Parish Council and not for Police Constable and therefore our powers are limited. Again, financial cuts mean that there is not the public money for building speed restrictions, or even installing speed signs. That said, be warned, there will be a police speed gun in the village in the coming year to try and get people to slow down!

More positive news includes the completion of the first year of the Village oil co-operative scheme, which has proved a great success, as well as the imminent roll-out of high-speed broadband which will make a big difference to many of us in the coming twelve months. Other highlights include new fencing on the playing fields to restrict joy-riding on the cricket pitch, and long-overdue renovation to the pavilion. Following the bad winter of 2010-11, new salt bins have been installed. But all of this pales into insignificance compared with the renovation and re-opening of The Punch Bowl which, after a difficult few months when the village was “dry”, is now re-invigorated and firmly back in the heart of the community.

The minutes of our Parish Council provide an important record of life in our community. Looking back over the numerous books in which this report and others reside, I am never tired of reading about what the issues were that faced the Parish in days gone by, and what they tell us about our community. Such reflection invites one to speculate on what future generations will make of the issues that face us today.

The single biggest concern in our Council’s minutes, during the last two years, has been the Allerton Park incinerator. We learnt in October 2011 of the full scale of the plans - a colossal incinerator that is designed to burn over 85% of the County’s waste for at least the next quarter of a century. We remain appalled that our County intends to embark on this massive financial white elephant, using a technology that is widely ridiculed as inefficient and polluting. And to what end? Not to support our local economy, that much is clear, nor to enhance our environment and protect the natural and historic heritage of the County. No, instead this billion-pound-plus scheme will pour money into the coffers of a Spanish-owned multi-national, to develop a scheme that will truck waste from every corner of the County to a single burner located in the open countryside where there is no use for the heat it generates. We oppose this scheme, together with many other Parish Councils and many thousands of residents from across the County. We welcomed the decision of Harrogate Borough Council Planning Committee, and then its full Council, to oppose the scheme in February of this year and we thank our local MPs, our District and County Councillors for their support. Together with City of York, this decision means that neither Harrogate nor York want an incinerator within their borders.

I want to finish this report with a final round of thanks. First, a big thank you to my fellow Parish Councillors for all of their help during what has been a very busy twelve months. Thanks to Roger for his hosting of the barn dance and the Italian evening as fund raisers for the incinerator campaign, to Tim for his continual support with the web site and on all technical aspects regarding waste management, and to Lynda for her gentle conversion of technical jargon to plain English! It has, as always, been a team effort. And beyond the Parish Council, we owe a huge debt of gratitude to Brian Cooper, whose energy and tenacious drive has kept us all going. But I save my last words for the many residents in the Parish who have helped us in the last twelve months. Thank you to all of you who have written letters of objection, attended meetings or given money to support our campaign - in years to come I am confident future generations will look back

on this time and be as impressed as I am by the collective effort to try to make our Parish, and by implication our County, a better, more sustainable place to live in.

3. The planning application for the Allerton Park Incinerator is likely to go before NYCC's Planning Committee in September when it is anticipated it will be approved. Subsequently it is likely to be "called in" by the Secretary of State and possibly referred to the Infrastructure Planning Commission (IPC).

### **Matters Arising**

#### **1. Playing Fields:**

- The PC is willing to install and pay for a kissing gate in the field behind the pub, where some residents are struggling to get over the stile. However, this would require the permission of the landowner.
- Yorkshire Water is looking at fencing off the area around the reservoir. They are undertaking similar work on other sites to improve security.
- Work on the pavilion on the playing fields is almost complete. An excellent job has been done.

#### **2. Village Shop/Village Hall:**

- Nothing to report.

#### **3. Incinerator:**

- See comments under "County Issues" (above).
- The Chair up-dated the meeting on AmeyCespa's initial response to the Planning Officer's various queries on the planning application.
- It was agreed the Chair should send a letter in support of NYWAG's objections to the application on transport grounds.
- AmeyCespa has submitted its application for an Environmental permit.

## **Correspondence**

- Restored shed on Limebar Lane: HBC Planning has confirmed that the materials used were acceptable and the building is for agricultural use only.
- Yore Vision is seeking letters of support regarding their aim to establish a long-distance footpath from Boroughbridge to Kirby Stephen via Richmond. It was agreed the Clerk should be requested to write in support of this plan.
- The YLCA has circulated a note inviting volunteers to join the local NY Police and Crime Panel.
- A resident has emailed enquiring why there is no bus service to Harrogate. It was agreed the PC would approach NYCC for a response.

## **Any other Business**

- The Clerk will contact Highways regarding pot-holes which are particularly bad on Limebar Lane from the A168 to the village side of Willow Tree Farm. The yellow paint has washed off those marked on Braimber Lane, some of which have been loosely patched.
- HBC have indicated they would consider a request to increase the number of parish councillors. However, they would require valid reasons to justify an addition which would put this PC out of line with similar parishes and populations. It was decided not to pursue the matter at this time.

## **The Chair opened the meeting to the public:**

- A member of the public proposed particular thanks to Nick Wilson for his sterling work over many years on the Parish Council. There was unanimous support for this comment, evidenced by a spontaneous round of applause.
- The point was made that there is a wealth of talent in the village (such as Nick's) and the PC was invited to call on people who might be happy to share their expertise.
- It was suggested a paragraph about each candidate standing for the recent election to the Parish Council would have been useful.
